Code Enforcement Report, Gary Post present - A report was presented. 1) Gary met with Alex Urda several times. He met with Vince who is putting in the ansul system. They will do a blow off test next week so he'll be down for that. She wants to open the bakery before Valentine's Day. 2) Talked to Key Bank regarding the signage at the bank. 3) He has been playing phone tag with the sign guy at 21 Main Street. The archeological study was submitted and there is a concern because of a few items found, such as cut glass, cut nails, and several other small items. The report has to go to the state for final approval so we just have to wait and see what they have to say. 3) Gary sent in his yearly report for the county and the state. 4) Spoke with Bob McKirtich regarding the violations at 185 Main Street. There has been no progress or response to the violation sent to the owner. We could take him to court. There needs to be more discussion with the village attorney before any decision could be made. 5) He wrote up 48 Grove Street. 6) There may be a Bed & Breakfast at 234 Main Street. Gary has met with him. It is zoned for it but it will require a 239 Review. 7) There is someone interested in 139 Main Street. They are putting in an offer. They would like to live in the house and eventually open a restaurant to the downstairs and would move upstairs to live. A restaurant is permitted with a special permit which would require a 239 Review.

Attorney Report - A report was submitted.

Streets Report, David Decker present - 1) We still have to purchase 100 tons of salt to meet our 70% requirement. He has room for about 20 tons at the salt bin now. We have till September to purchase it. 2) The salt spreader was sold for \$300 to Dave Brown. 3) The roads are in decent shape. No major potholes. Trustee West asked David if he was going to get the bids out early for street paving. David stated yes.

Water Report, David Decker present - 1) David met with representatives from Servline, an insurance company through National Rural Water, offering a program for the residential users of municipalities. It's a fairly new program that will benefit both us as the utility and the consumer with no cost to the utility. The monthly fee would be between \$1-\$3 per month for water loss due to leaking pipes/toilet's, resulting in high water bills. There is no deductible. Another program is to provide protection for service line repairs/replacement up to \$10,000/year. That cost is between 3.50-5.50/month. They can also offer freeze protection for an additional small fee. Any resident can opt out. They would like to come out and do a presentation to the village. They will be back in the area in March if we can make time to meet with them.

Treasurer's Report, Patricia Harting present - A report was presented. We received our 4th quarter sales. It's a little bit higher than expected. Patti has jury duty on Monday, February 8th & 9th in Binghamton City Court.
