Public Comment - 1) Resident Pat Phillips was present to ask when the sidewalk paving will be done. David stated he got a call today and they told him it would be before the end of October. The board expressed their displeasure in this situation. This is the 3rd year that they have put us off to the very end. The Clerk stated that if they haven't submitted a bill by the next meeting on November 1st, it's a real problem because we won't get the money back during this fiscal year.

2) Resident Elaine Card noted that the Art Gallery has their final showing this Saturday. They will be closing the door on October 29th. Maybe the Village Board would want to recognize the Pesce's and their contribution to the community. 3) Alex Quinn wanted to discuss his Eagle Project for a sign in the park in memory/honor of cancer survivors. The board had some suggestions of materials to be used that might deter any vandalism that may occur to it. Resident Jim Miller asked if the plaque becomes the property of the village and would the village have to do the upkeep and repair to it in the future when the young lad moves on in life. The mayor stated yes. He was asked to come to the meeting next week.

Rural Health Network, Carolyn Russo was present. Carolyn wanted to talk about rural housing. She did a slideshow.

Code Enforcement Report, Gary Post present - A report was presented. 1) The Dollar General had several snags. The rebar wasn't right, the concrete work was a problem along with elevations. The steel work is supposed to start on Thursday. 2) Met a few times with the guy doing the block work on Maple Ave. There was a problem. They set the house today. 3) The house at 117 Main Street was to be demolished last Wednesday and SHIPPO put a stop on it. We're back on schedule again but we're at the bottom of the list with the demo company. They have a tentative date for starting the week of October 17th. 4) 185 Main Street has been moving forward. It looks good. He's done everything that we have asked. We're supposed to go back to court tomorrow. Gary will talk with the Attorney. 5) There have been complaints from a homeowner regarding his neighbor. Gary has been involved and doing what he can to keep the peace. 6) Gary and the mayor met with Bob McKirtich regarding a response to DEC. We sent a letter to Mary Binder. She shortened the time frame in which the matters had to be taken care of. We need a certification of the elevation for the poop holder in the field on the farm. Keystone submitted a proposal for \$700 to do an elevation certificate. Tom was concerned that

we may be setting a precedence for us paying the costs from someone who should have gotten a permit. The bottom line is that the village is responsible for the village floodplain management.
